

Crew Safety Guidelines – Working at/around the tanks/pools

- All water and safety related activities will and must go through the Dive Master.
- The Dive Master and the 1st A.D. will conduct safety meetings prior to any work in the pool/tank. Personnel who are uncomfortable working in or around water should notify their supervisor prior to call.
- Only those qualified should be working in the water. The designated crew in the pool/tank will include as required: Underwater Camera Crew, Safety and FX Divers, Underwater Grip, Lighting, Stunt Doubles and Cast.
- For those authorized to go in the water, please be sure to use the foot baths provided to disinfect your feet, each time you enter the water. Maintaining clean water is crucial for health and safety while working in the water. The water will be tested and monitored through out the day.
- All personnel should be advised to keep all potential contaminants away from the water. This includes paints, thinners, repellants, gasoline, oils etc.
- Be aware of the area you're working in. Never rush or hurry working in and around this environment. Always be sure of your footing.

ELECTRICITY ISSUE: Clearly extra special care must be used when working with electrical power around water. The Rigging Electrics are using GFI power (ground fault interrupters) and all power and lights will be strapped down. All electrical connections should be made by (approved by), or under the supervision of a qualified lighting department member. This includes monitors, hair dryers and so on.

Please listen carefully to the safety meeting and ask questions if you are at all unclear about the filming activity in the pool/tank. These are basic guidelines. Please use caution at all times. Safety first.
