
Crew Safety Procedures While Working Around Tanks and Pools

- All water and safety-related activities must go through the dive supervisor.
- The dive supervisor and first assistant director will conduct safety meetings prior to any work in the pool/tank.
- Personnel who are uncomfortable working in or around water should notify their supervisor prior to call.
- Any individual using scuba equipment while filming or being filmed underwater must be an experienced and certified diver, with the exception of performers who are essential for an underwater close-up. In this instance, actors will be under the supervision of a certified occupational diver, and will have received sufficient instructions beforehand.
- If you are authorized to enter the water, make sure to use the footbaths provided to disinfect your feet. Maintaining clean water is crucial for health and safety during filming, and it will be tested throughout the day.
- Keep all potential contaminants away from the water, including paint thinners, repellants, oils, etc.
- Be aware of your work area and footing, ensuring never to rush.

ELECTRICITY NOTE: Extra care must be taken when working with electrical power around water. All electrical connections, including monitors, hair dryers, etc., should be approved under the supervision of a qualified Lighting Department member. The rigging electrics use GFI power (ground fault interrupters), and all power and lights will be strapped down.
