
Crew Safety Procedures While Filming On Docks

- There will be a safety meeting at crew call. Please listen carefully and ask questions if you are unclear about the filming activity on the water. Please inform a member of the A.D. Team or the Marine Crew if you are uncomfortable working on the water.
- We will have safety personnel on set while working on and around the water. They are the only crew to enter the water in an emergency. They will be maintaining watch over general operations throughout the day. Please obey their direction as they are on set for your safety.
- Direct all marine requests through the Marine Coordinator or Assistant Coordinator, including requests for shuttles. Please inform the Marine Coordinator if you see anything that you feel is unsafe.
- Lifejackets are available on the dock and in the boats. If there is any risk of drowning you are expected to wear a lifejacket provided. The marine coordinator will have final say regarding the mandatory use of lifejackets as conditions warrant.
- All persons should wear close-toe, non-skid, and rubber-soled shoes when working on docks.
- Be careful not to overload the dock with excess crew and gear.
- Use extreme care while working on boats, barges and docks. Be aware of tripping hazards; always look behind you before stepping back. If you are working near an edge, please partner up or ask for safety personnel to stand by.
- Not all boats at a dock are necessarily being contracted by Production even if they are in a shot. If you need access onto a boat and are unsure whether the boat is for Production use or not, ask a member of the Marine Department or Locations Department.
- Please treat all boats with respect. The owners of these boats spend a lot of time and money on their upkeep and very graciously allow us to use them. Be careful where you place equipment and yourself, and if in doubt ask someone from the Marine Crew for help.
- Life rings are stationed around the set and are to be used by any crewmember observing a person in the water requiring immediate assistance. Dedicate one person to maintain a watch on the person in the water until such time they are rescued. Please notify all crew by yelling and drawing attention to the person in the water so that safety personnel can respond.
