
Crew Safety Procedures While Working On Picture Boats

- Direct all requests through the marine coordinator or assistant coordinator.
- Lifejackets are available on both docks and boats; the marine coordinator will have the final say regarding the mandatory use of lifejackets as conditions warrant.
- Smoking is prohibited on boats, allowed only in designated areas on barges and docks.
- Always wear closed-toe, non-skid and rubber-soled shoes when working on watercrafts.
- Please treat picture boats with respect and be careful when operating heavy or sharp equipment, ensuring to use blankets and padding to protect the vessel. While picture boats are often altered to appear aged during filming, they are generally very expensive and fragile, and owners graciously allow us to use them.
- Do not apply any kind of tape to a picture boat without approval from the marine coordinator.
- Unless you are specifically told otherwise, do not enter the wheelhouse of the boat; this is a very small space where the operator needs to be able to concentrate.
- Only the marine crew can dock and undock the vessel and tie the lines; please remain clear of the boat during this process.
- The operator of the vessel is in command of all activity that occurs on board, and has the final judgment regarding safety and crew conduct.
