

Chest Wader Memo

- Chest waders are only to be used when safety personnel have deemed them appropriate; due to shifting water levels, this requirement can change over the course of a shooting day.
- Take precautions while walking in chest waders, as the combination of slippery rocks and icy conditions can be hazardous.
- Reduce the weight of your gear and ask for assistance to maintain balance.
- Exercise extreme caution when working around moving water; currents are usually stronger than they appear, and conditions can change quickly with little or no warning.
- Never enter depths greater than your waist, for risk of filling your waders with cold water and being swept away. The marine crew will provide safer solutions in deeper water.
- Waders must be worn with equipped belt
- Lifejackets will always be supplied, and must be worn with waders.
- Wear fleece and wool along with layered socks to keep warm.
- Be careful not to rip or puncture your chest waders, and keep them dry in between uses.
